Wilson University, in its nature as an online school with uniquely specific degrees, does not have a student base of first-time, full-time freshmen; therefore, the time to graduation rate is effected by a large number of students transferring in credits to complete their degree.

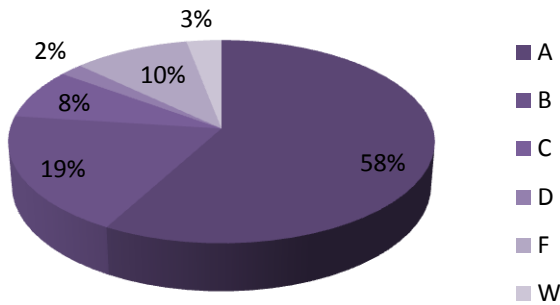
The associate's degree requires 60 units for graduation. On average, WU graduating students took 12 units in the spring and 15 units in the fall completing 27 units per year. Typically it would take a first-time, full-time freshman 2 ½ years to complete an associate's degree. program has an average of 2 years for completions.

A bachelor's degree requires 120 units for graduation. Using the same full-time possibility of 27 units completed in a year, a typical first-time, full-time student would take 4 ½ years to complete a bachelor's degree. Wilson Pacific bachelor's degree graduates' took an average of 3.1 years for completing their degree.

Wilson University requires 36 units to complete a master's degree. Students typically will take 9 units in the fall and 6 units in the spring; earning 15 units per year. This would mean a master student would need 2 ½ years to complete their degree. The average for WU graduate students had a rate of 2.3 years to graduation.

Wilson University had an 87% average of passing grades for the 2-year comparison (2014-15 and 2015-16). The university reports a 3% course drop rate for this time period.

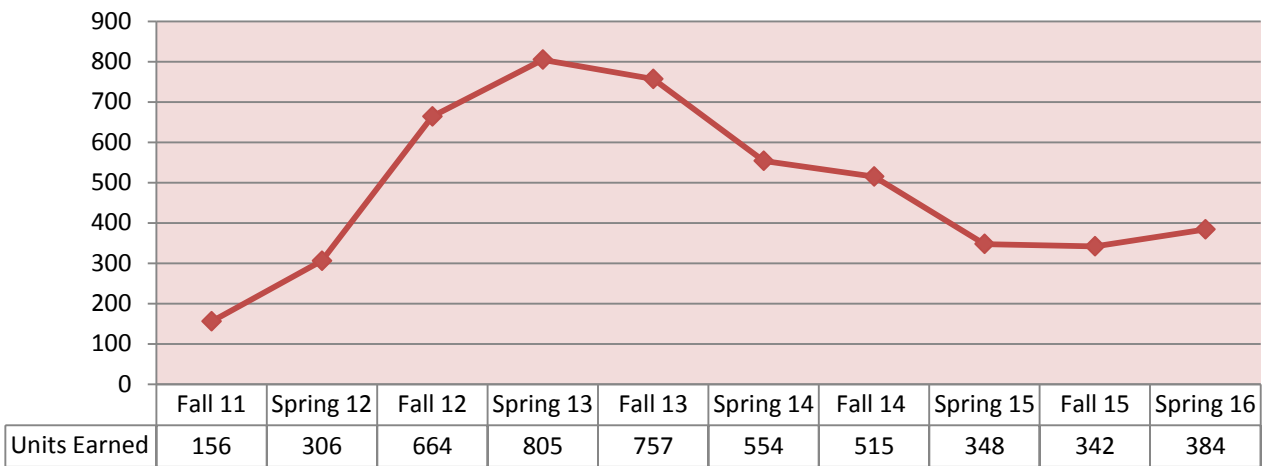
For the academic years 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 the average GPA for an undergraduate, degree-seeking students was: 3.25

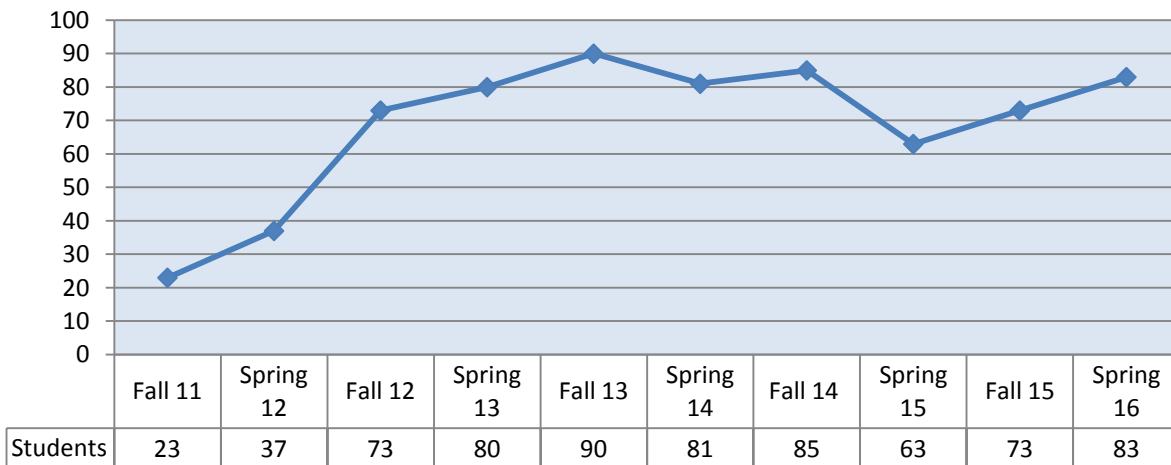

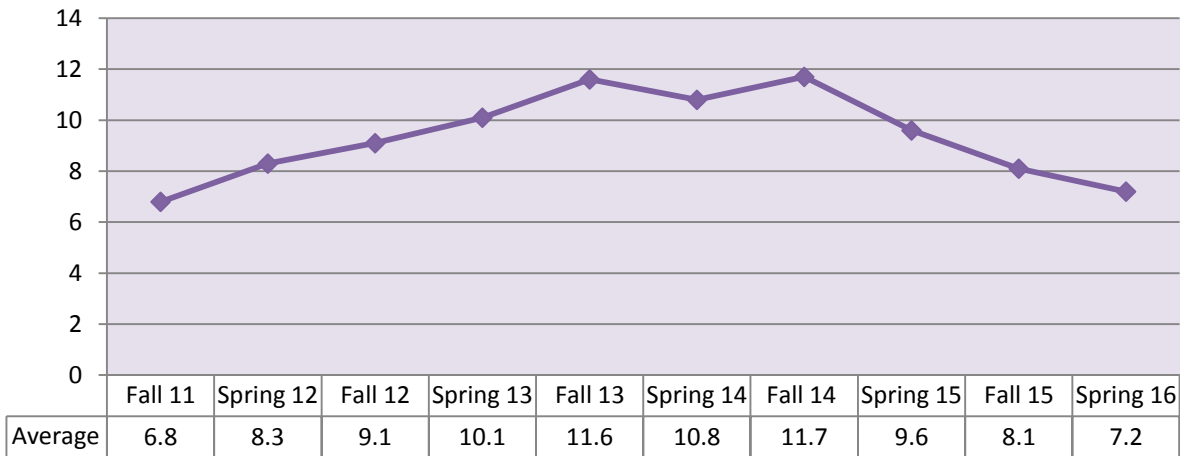
Number of Students per Semester Earning Units

Graduate Degree-Seeking Program

Wilson University has run 7 cohorts for the graduate program, since 2009. The university had a graduation rate of 54% for the graduate program and the one year retention for 2015-16 was 76%.

*Definition:

Annual Cohort	A group of students who share the same academic entry year. An academic entry year is defined as July 1 st to June 30 th . Students are included in the annual cohort when they matriculate.
One-Year Retention Rate	The number of students in the Annual Cohort who are enrolled or graduated on year after their specific entry date divided by the number of students in the Annual Cohort.
Persistence Rate	The number of students in the Annual Cohort who are actively pursuing a degree or have graduated as of the last day of the academic year (June 30, 2015) divided by the number of students in the Annual Cohort.
